

Swedenborgiana Updates

On July 13th Marvin Clymer and I delivered thirteen volumes of *The New Jerusalem Messenger*, 1855-1867, to the Conservation Center for Art & Historic Artifacts for digitization. These historic volumes, covering an important time in the history of the New Church in America, are extremely large and fragile and required special scanning equipment that we do not have in house. Thanks to a generous grant from the Glencairn Foundation we were able to have them digitized professionally. The photo shows us delivering the journals.

Rev. Dr. Andy Dibb and I are in the process of working on a new exhibit using books from Swedenborgiana to illustrate Swedenborg's preparation by the Lord. The exhibit is arranged in six stages of Swedenborg's life from his early life and introduction to the natural sciences to his final revelation. In Rev. Dibb's introductory notes to the exhibit he mentions that Swedenborg was once asked why he was chosen to be the revelator for the New Church. His answer is seen in his letter to Oetinger, November 11, 1766, as follows:

"It is for the reason that the spiritual things which are now being revealed may be taught and understood naturally and rationally; for spiritual truths have correspondence with natural truths, it being in these

*that they terminate, and upon them they rest...therefore, I was introduced by the Lord first into the natural sciences and thus prepared, and this from the year 1710 to 1744 when heaven was opened to me." **

This exhibit will also highlight our special Swedenborgiana collections and illustrate why the early founders of the Academy thought it important to collect these works. We will keep you posted on the opening this fall of the exhibit.

20th Anniversary of 9/11

We were happy to receive a set of 14 posters from the NYC 9/11 Memorial Museum. We put up a book display in the area outside the "All Hours" café space. We have 18 books in our collection that address 9/11, terrorism, and the effects of the attack over the past 20

years, including a couple of New Church publications, as well as four journals issued in September and October 2001 that focused on reaction to the tragedy. The museum posters walk us through the events of that terrible day as well as discussing the aftermath, first responders'

heroism, the War on Terrorism, and Operation Enduring Freedom. Many of our students were not yet born that year, or were infants and toddlers. Faculty, staff, and community members have clear, lasting memories of this tragedy and stories to tell.
