Jonathan Rose speaks at the FOSL annual meeting

The Annual Meeting of the Friends of the Swedenborg Library was held on Sunday, February 12, 2017 in the Pendleton Hall Chapel. Margaret Gladish was elected to another term as Vice President, and Alaine York to a second term as Secretary. Reports from the Treasurer, the President, and Library Director were also presented. A proposal for the Annual Friends Gift to the Library was made by the Library Director Carol Traveny for a computer kiosk to be installed on the second floor of the library. This computer station will be available to patrons who wish to access the online catalog or check information on the library website. Additional funding toward the College program "Long Night Against Procrastination", a popular event, held each term in the

library to support academic achievement, was also proposed. Members approved \$4,000 that will cover the expenses of both projects.

However, the highlight of the event preceded the business meeting, in the form of a fascinating talk by the Rev. Dr. Jonathan S. Rose. Rose's talk, titled "Indexing his way into further enlightenment: discovering Swedenborg's work process through translation" described the intricate and mind-bending work of translating the manuscripts of Emanuel Swedenborg. Swedenborg's ideas and understanding grew as he read and re-read his manuscripts. Beyond the simple keyword cross-references we are familiar with, the indexes Swedenborg constructed serve as records of his evolving

theology. He used them to note new insights; to record additional thoughts and experiences; and to expand on ideas developed in earlier drafts. Swedenborg's indexes are complex works in

Carroll's Corner: Swedenborgiana

Recent research about Swedenborg and the New Church has been keeping me busy the past few months. Several requests came from scholars who are speakers at the upcoming "Swedenborg and the Arts Conference" held on the Bryn Athyn College campus June 6-9th. I've had a request for information on Rev. John Isaac Hawkins, a Methodist minister who was introduced to the Doctrines of the New Church by Rev. James Hindmarsh in 1785. He was ordained in 1805 and was active as a minister to New Church societies in Great Britain until his death in 1820.

Another request was from a

history professor at St. Vincent College, for a copy of the rare book *A Word of Advice*, by Benedict Chastanier 1795. Only two copies known in the world, one in Stockholm and the other a photocopy at the Swedenborg Society, London. We were able to get a scan from the Swedenborg Society, which we added to our collection and also sent on to the professor. The professor is working on a book about Rev. Manoah Sibly, an early New Church minister in London.

Also, a request for a copy of the handwritten French translation by Rev. E.E.Jungerich of *Spiritual Experiences* for Rev. Sylvain Agnes, our pastor in Abidjan, Ivory Coast.

From a conference speaker came a request for information on Swedenborg and Dostoevsky and the article written on this topic by Ceslaw Milosez published in *Slavic Review* in 1955.


There have been many other fascinating inquiries. Be sure to attend the conference coming in June to hear more!

Besides working on research requests, I'm taking an inventory of the New Church collection and updating records when needed. This is a tedious, but very crucial endeavor as the last full inventory was conducted many years ago. If working with rare books and the New Church collections has an interest for you, please feel free to contact me, as I could use a volunteer or two to help with the inventory and shifting of books.
