In order to support the new Business Major at Bryn Athyn College, the Swedenborg Library has purchased several new business resources from EBSCO.

Business Source Premier

One of the leading research databases in the field of business, Business Source Premier contains 2,300 journals, with full text for 1,100. The database covers a time span from 1886 to the present and is updated daily. This comprehensive research database provides coverage in all business disciplines such as marketing, management, accounting, finance, economics and more. The searching and browsing features are easy to use-- with online tutorials, user's guides and 24/7 help line support.

Business eBook Collection

This collection, covering various business research topics, will help students and scholars understand general business concepts. The ebooks present a wide spectrum of business subjects such as supply chain management, entrepreneurship, finance, marketing, career and personal growth, networking, communication, etc.

Regional Business News

This database provides full text coverage of more than 80 regional business publications in cities and rural areas in the United States.

New books of note: pleasure reading for the holidays

We have a number of fantastic new books in the library. Take some time out from your busy winter term/holiday schedules for some engaging, enjoyable reading. As always, our staff can assist you in finding these or other literary treats just waiting for you on our shelves!

For fans of crime fiction, two series offer dozens of entertaining, quick-read options. First, **Robert Parker's "Spenser" novels** feature the witty, irreverent, ex-boxer, ex-policeman private eye facing all sorts of questionable clients, unexpected allies, and various, nefarious characters in and around the city of Boston. We now have most of Parker's decades-spanning series. **Rex Stout**, one of the grand masters of American mystery writing, gives us the world's "largest and smartest detective": curmudgeonly, orchid-fancying, **Nero Wolfe**. Check him out in a

new two-in-one paperback series. You can find all the Spenser and Nero Wolfe books in the Mystery section of our Fiction collection. (*Fic Parke MYSTERY and Fic Stout MYSTERY*)

Thrity Umrigar's "The world we found" is a novel that explores the "enduring bonds of friendship and the power of love to change lives, and offer[s] an unforgettable portrait of modern India." (from the book jacket.) (*Fic Umrig 2012*)

A selection of brief, atmospheric, and intense tales by the Japanese Nobel Prize winner **Yasunari Kawabata** will intrigue and astonish you. Seventy miniature worlds are created and collected in his "**Palm of the hand stories.**" (*PL832.A9 A23 1988*)

Finally, for a new look at the land of fire and ice, savor **Feo Pitcairn's** latest photographic exploration: "**Primordial landscapes: Iceland revealed.**"

With gorgeous color photographs and poetry by Icelandic writer Ari Trausti Guðmundsson, your armchair tour of this fascinating and wildly beautiful country is booked and ready for you to embark. (*TR660.5 .P58 2015 Oversize*)
